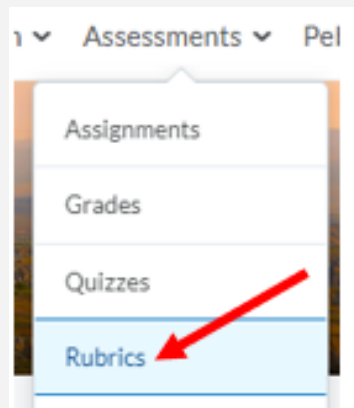


# 1.5.4 Rubrics

This tutorial covers how to create a rubric on Avenue. Rubrics are an important tool that can make Grad Attributes much simpler and help TAs when marking. You can attach a rubric to a specific assessment, which will be shown in 1.5.5.

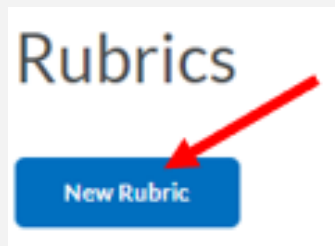
## STEP 1

From your Avenue course, navigate to **Assessments** → **Rubrics**.



## STEP 2

Select **New Rubric**.



## STEP 3

Your first step will be to name the rubric and change the **Scoring** to **Custom Points**

## STEP 4

You can now type in your desired points for each level, write in feedback for each column, and relabel the names of the criterion. Fill in the whole rubric as desired, and if needed, you can add additional criterion.

## STEP 5

At the bottom, there is an overall rubric score. Make sure that it correctly reflects what you want to include on your rubric as well. You need to manually adjust this to your criteria as Avenue does not do it for you.

Each submission is assigned a level of achievement based on its overall rubric score.

## STEP 6

There is also an **Options** section. Select this to view more features you can manage for your rubric. Once you are done, you can close the rubric.
